#### **PCR TESTS FOR OUTGOING TRAVELLERS**

We are in receipt of several enquiries from members regarding some recent news reports carried in the Media to the effect that ALL outgoing travellers require to present a PCR Negative Certificate. The revised rules are allegedly attributed to the Tourism and Wildlife CS statement in the amended Tourism and Hospitality Health and Safety Protocols.

We wish to clarify that the current regulations require all passengers **coming to Kenya** to be in possession of a valid COVID-19 negative PCR test certificate conducted within 96 hours before travel.

The PCR requirements for **outgoing travellers** are as contained in the attached KCAA Circular of 8<sup>th</sup> June, 2021 which indicates that passengers traveling out of the country will be required to abide by the particular travel, health and COVID-19 related requirements **of the destination country**.

Members are urged to familiarize themselves with the destination requirements which differ from country to country and are usually communicated by the Airlines at the time of booking travel.
